


Actress-Politician Divya Spandana Files Complaint Over Death and Rape Threats

MUMBAI (News Desk) — South Indian Kannada film actress and Lok Sabha member from Karnataka, Divya Spandana, also known as Ramya, has decided to file a police complaint after receiving threats on social media. According to the actress, she is being harassed online by fans of actor Darshan, who is accused of murder. The 43-year-old



shared a copy of the police complaint on her social media platform X. In an interview with Indian media, she revealed that Darshan's fans have been sending her threats of murder and rape. Speaking about the online abuse, she expressed concern over the growing trend of verbal attacks on women, stating that such individuals often begin by questioning women's character. The threats reportedly stem from comments related to the murder of 33-year-old Renuka Swamy. Actor Darshan, who was released on bail by the Karnataka High Court,

Crackdown on Vulgar Theatre Content in Faisalabad Theatres

FAISALABAD (News Desk) — In line with special directives from Punjab's Minister for Information and Culture Uzma Zahid Bukhari, the Secretary Information, the Executive Director of Punjab Council of the Arts Lahore, and the Parliamentary Secretary for Culture, a strict crackdown has been launched against vulgar, obscene, and unethical content in theatres across Faisalabad Division. Over the past six months, 67 show-cause notices have been issued to various commercial theatres in Faisalabad for violating cultural and moral standards through indecent dialogues, unethical acts, and vulgar dance performances. Two theatres were sealed on separate occasions during this period. These actions are part of a comprehensive



strategy to restore Punjab's cultural values and transform theatre into a family-friendly entertainment medium. Deputy Director of Punjab Council of the Arts Faisalabad, Muhammad Imran Raza, is working closely with the district administration for continuous monitoring, including surprise inspections, nighttime surveillance, and e-monitoring systems. In an official statement, the Deputy Director emphasized that this sends a clear message to theatre owners, directors, and actors to strictly follow the prescribed SOPs and promote the richness of Punjabi language and culture through positive content. While the Punjab Council of the Arts encourages creative expression, it will not tolerate vulgarity or obscenity. More than 30 daily reports of surprise inspections have been submitted to higher authorities.

No Sequel for Drama Serial "Mayi Ri", Confirms Director



LAHORE (News Desk) - Director Meesam Naqvi has confirmed that there will be no sequel to the popular 2023 drama serial Mayi Ri, stating that the story had already concluded in the original season. The drama was well-received for its unique storyline, which focused on the social issue of child marriage. It starred Aina Asif and Samar Jafri in lead roles, whose on-screen pairing was widely appreciated. The narrative depicted their early-age marriage, becoming parents, and eventually getting divorced. After the drama's conclusion, fans, critics, and showbiz figures called for a sequel. However, in an appearance on the show Kya Drama Hai, Meesam Naqvi clarified that since the central theme—child marriage had already been addressed and resolved, it would not be appropriate to restart the topic. Therefore, a sequel will not be made. He added that due to the popularity of Aina Asif and Samar Jafri, they cast the duo again in their new drama Parwaaz.

Sultana Siddiqui Says Slapping Women Not Allowed in HUM TV

LAHORE (News Desk) – Sultana Siddiqui, President of private TV channel HUM TV, drama producer, and renowned former director, has stated that she does not allow scenes where women are slapped in dramas aired on her channel, though occasionally such scenes still occur. In a recent appearance



on a Pakistan Television (PTV) podcast, she openly discussed her career, the launch of her TV network, and related matters. Speaking about television dramas, she noted that although many TV channels have emerged, most of their directors, producers, and writers lacked strong experience—something she worked to develop. She expressed pride in having trained many people, claiming that individuals she mentored are now being hired by other channels for higher pay—up to Rs. 800,000 compared to Rs. 200,000 earlier which she sees as a positive sign. She mentioned that up to 21 dramas are aired weekly on her channels, and in most of them, slapping female characters is not permitted. However, she acknowledged that in one or two dramas a week, a woman might still be slapped, which she said reflects real life to some extent. Nonetheless, she maintains a strict policy against allowing repeated slapping of women in her dramas. Sultana Siddiqui emphasized that her life, principles, and even the dramas on HUM TV do not permit such portrayals of violence against women.
