Aamir Khan's Family Responds to Serious Allegations by Faisal Khan



MUMBAI (News Desk) - The family of Bollywood actor Aamir Khan has responded to serious allegations made by his brother, actor Faisal Khan. Recently, in an interview, Faisal recalled the past, claiming that Aamir had kept him confined at home for an entire year. According to Faisal, the family told him he was suffering from schizophrenia and was a danger to society. "These things were being said in my house," Faisal stated, adding that he wondered how he would get out of the situation as the whole family considered him insane. He further revealed that he had been waiting for help from his father, who lived away with his second wife and whose contact number Faisal did not have. "Aamir kept me locked in the house for a year. My phone was taken away, I couldn't step outside, and guards were stationed outside my room to give me medicines," Faisal alleged. In response, the family has denied Faisal's claims of being confined and forcibly medicated. According to Indian media, the family's expressed sadness over accusations made against Faisal's mother, sister, and brother Aamir. They noted that this was not the first time Faisal had misrepresented events, prompting them to clarify their stance. The statement stressed that every decision regarding Faisal was taken collectively by the family in consultation with medical professionals, and was based on love, compassion, and concern for his emotional and psychological wellbeing. The family explained that this was why they had refrained from publicly sharing details of that difficult and painful time. Aamir Khan's family also appealed to the media not to turn a private matter into sensational, provocative, and hurtful speculation.

Rajinikanth's Fee for Film Coolie Stuns Fans

MUMBAI (News Desk) – The remuneration of legendary Indian actor Rajinikanth for his upcoming film Coolie has surprised many. Scheduled for release on August 14, the bigbudget film also stars Aamir Khan, Upendra, and others. The production budget is estimated between ₹350 to ₹400 crore. Reports reveal that the actors' fees for the project have left audiences astonished. Aamir Khan, appearing in a short role of about 15– 20 minutes, has reportedly been paid ₹20 crore for his performance. Surprisingly, superstar Rajinikanth has charged ₹200 crore for the film. Sources indicate that Rajinikanth's initial fee was ₹150 crore, but the producers increased it after witnessing a massive surge in advance bookings ahead of the film's release. Other cast members, including Sathyaraj and Shruti Haasan, have each been paid ₹4 crore, while the director has reportedly received ₹50 crore for his work on the project.

Jackie Chan Admits Fear of Dying During Dangerous Stunts




BANGKOK (News Desk) – World-famous action star Jackie Chan, known for performing his own stunts, has revealed that despite his reputation, he is often fearful before executing dangerous scenes and worries he might die on set. Speaking at the Locarno Film Festival in Switzerland, the 71-year-old actor admitted he always feels nervous before shooting major action sequences and sometimes wonders if the next stunt could be his last. "I'm not Superman. Before every stunt, I feel fear and think—am I going to die this time?"he confessed. Despite his concerns, Jackie Chan emphasized that he remains capable of performing his own martial arts scenes and continues striving for perfection in his work, even in his eighth decade of life. He added that audiences don't care about producers, budgets, or behind-the-scenes details—they just want a good film. "I always keep that in mind, which is why I try to make every scene perfect," he said. Chan also remarked that older films were often better than today's, as modern big studios are run more by businesspeople than true filmmakers, making it harder to create truly great movies.

Kapil Sharma Placed Under Police Protection After Canada Café Shootings

MUMBAI (News Desk) – Indian comedian Kapil Sharma has been provided security by Mumbai Police following two shooting incidents at his café in Canada over the past month. According to Indian media reports, the 43-year-old comedian opened Kap's Café in Canada earlier this year as part of an international business venture. The café was targeted in two separate shootings, on July 10 and August 7, which fortunately caused no casualties but raised serious security concerns. While Canadian police have not officially named the establishment involved, media outlets have identified Kapil Sharma's café as the target. Authorities are investigating both incidents to determine whether the shootings are linked to organized criminal activity. Sources indicate that Sharma has been in constant contact with Canadian authorities since the attacks and is fully cooperating with the investigation. After the most recent shooting, concerns have grown over potential escalation of violent incidents, with unconfirmed reports suggesting possible involvement of an online gang.



Acting Coach Says Triptii Dimri Made Wrong Film Choices After Animal



MUMBAI (News Desk) – Bollywood actress Triptii Dimri's acting coach, Saurabh Sachdeva, has praised her talent but criticized her recent choice of films following the blockbuster Animal. According to Indian media reports, the 31-year-old actress rose to stardom after starring alongside Ranbir Kapoor in Animal, which boosted her demand in the industry. However, she has recently faced criticism for appearing in films such as Bad News and Woh Wala Video with Vicky and Vidya, both of which failed to make an impact at the box office. In a recent interview, Sachdeva described Dimri as a "wonderful actress" who looks great on camera, works hard, and is emotionally sensitive, but said her film selection has been poor. Angelina Jolie to Sell Historic Los Feliz. Mansion Once Owned by Cecil B. DeMille



NEW YORK (News Desk) – Hollywood star Angelina Jolie is preparing to sell her historic Los Feliz estate, which was once home to legendary filmmaker Cecil B. DeMille. Jolie purchased the property in 2017 for \$24.5 million. The mansion, built in 1913, sits on more than two acres and features six bedrooms, ten bathrooms, four fireplaces, a spacious wine cellar, a tea house, views of the Griffith Observatory, formal gardens, and a pool with waterfalls. DeMille lived there for nearly 40 years. During the COVID-19 pandemic, Jolie resided in the mansion with her children and even offered shelter to friends who had been displaced by wildfires in Los Angeles. The property has been meticulously restored to its original architectural style, with elegant moldings, classic woodwork, grand drawing rooms, and French doors.

Box Office Pressure Is a "Male Problem," Says Shruti Haasan

MUMBAI (News Desk) – Popular Bollywood and South Indian actress Shruti Haasan believes that the pressure of box office numbers is primarily a "male problem," affecting male actors and directors more than their female counterparts. In an interview with an Indian media outlet, the 39-year-old actress explained that while women in the film industry face their own set of challenges, she feels that box office performance concerns mostly trouble men. When asked if she personally worries about box office figures, Shruti said, "The bigger pressure is on male actors and directors, whose entire week— Monday through Friday—revolves around box office performance. For films led by women, the numbers are never quite the same. The main concern is usually whether the film covers its costs and performs decently, not about joining the 2000-crore club or the next big milestone."
