25 Years Since Legendary Pop Singer Nazia Hassan Passed Away



KARACHI (News Desk) – It has been 25 years since the passing of Nazia Hassan, the iconic queen of pop music and internationally acclaimed Pakistani singer. Born on April 3, 1965, in Karachi, Nazia gained fame at a young age and passed away at only 35. At 15, she rose to prominence, and her song Aap Jaisa Koi for the Bollywood film Qurbani brought her worldwide recognition. Alongside her brother Zoheb Hassan, she introduced a new dimension to Pakistani music, leaving a lasting impact wherever Urdu songs reached. Her famous Urdu hits include Disco Deewane, Boom Boom, and Ankhein Milane Wale, while her English track Dreamer Deewane gained global popularity. She sold over 65 million records worldwide and earned numerous awards, including the Pride of Performance and Best Female Playback Singer. Nazia was diagnosed with lung cancer and passed away on August 13, 2000, in a London hospital.

Dr. Nabiha Ali Khan Sparks Controversy: "A Man Never Hits a Woman Without Reason

KARACHI (News Desk) – Self-proclaimed psychologist and controversial social media star Dr. Nabiha Ali Khan has stated that no matter how bad a man is, he does not physically harm a woman without reason, claiming it is psychologically impossible for a man to hit a woman first. Speaking in a TV program a few days ago, she discussed domestic violence, relationships between men and women, and their responsibilities. She said that although Pakistan is an Islamic republic, its laws are not in accordance with Islam, and only lawmakers would know why that is so. According to her, religion commands that if a husband calls his wife, she should respond and obey him. She stated there is nothing wrong in complying with a husband's call or obedience, adding that the definition of domestic violence is often misinterpreted. She argued that if a husband refuses something or ignores his wife, it is labeled as violence, insult, or abuse, and this misunderstanding has persisted for years. She claimed men never compromise on two things—their ego and their income—yet wives often cross boundaries on these very matters. Dr. Nabiha Ali Khan said a man slaps a woman only when matters cross the limit, insisting that even the worst men do not hit women without provocation. She maintained that psychologically, it is impossible for a man to raise his hand against a woman without cause, and such situations arise only after heated exchanges and extreme arguments from both sides. During the program, she also urged a male guest to oppose laws she claimed were biased against men, arguing that most rules and regulations being made favor women. Addressing him, she said that if this continues, men will remain oppressed, and throughout the program, she repeatedly called men victims compared to women. Dr. Nabiha Ali Khan has faced criticism in the past for controversial statements, and her latest remarks have once again sparked backlash on social media, with users calling for a ban on her television appearances.


Mithun Chakraborty Threatens Pakistan with Missile and "Tsunami" in Response to Bilawal Bhutto's Remarks

MUMBAI (News Desk) - A factual statement by Bilawal Bhutto has unsettled Indian hardliners, prompting Bollywood actor and Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) leader Mithun Chakraborty to lash out with threats against Pakistan. Discarding diplomatic norms and political courtesy, Chakraborty warned that if "our patience runs out," India would launch a BrahMos missile at Pakistan and then another. In another viral video, he said that if nothing else happened, India would build a dam and, when needed, release its waters. "This way no bullets will be fired, but a tsunami will come," he claimed. When an Indian journalist asked him about alleged nuclear threats against



India, Mithun Chakraborty responded, "I am saying it myself—there will be a tsunami, and it will sweep everything away." He added, "I apologize; we have no issue with the people of Pakistan. My comments are only for their leadership." He clarified that Pakistani citizens are peace-loving and do not want war, but the problem lies with elements that spread provocation. It is worth noting that former Foreign Minister Bilawal Bhutto, during a speech in Bhit Shah, had said that if India even thinks of attacking the Indus River, then people from every province of Pakistan will be ready to confront them. He further stated that an attack on the Indus River would be considered an attack on Pakistan's civilization and culture.

Kangana Ranaut Slams Jaya Bachchan Over Viral Selfie Incident



MUMBAI (News Desk) – Bollywood actress Kangana Ranaut lashed out at Samajwadi Party Member of Parliament, actress, and Bollywood star Amitabh Bachchan's wife, Jaya Bachchan, for pushing away a man who tried to take a selfie with her. The incident's video went viral on social media, prompting BJP MP Kangana Ranaut to post a strongly worded note on her Instagram story, harshly criticizing Jaya Bachchan. Condemning her action, Kangana labeled Jaya Bachchan as the most spoiled, embarrassing, and privileged woman. The Emergency actress wrote that people tolerate her tantrums and nonsense only because she is Amitabh Bachchan's wife. She further remarked that the Samajwadi Party cap looks like a rooster's comb, while Jaya Bachchan herself resembles a fighting hen—calling it a matter of shame and disgrace. The actress-turned-politician Jaya Bachchan reportedly lost her temper when a man at the Constitution Club in New Delhi tried to take a selfie with her. The viral clip shows Jaya Bachchan pushing the man away while asking, "What are you doing? What is this?" Soon after the video surfaced, social media users expressed disappointment and condemned her behavior. Some even urged others to stop giving the actress any attention. One user commented that this is her repeated behavior and questioned why people are so eager to take selfies with such personalities. Another called it very rude, while a third remarked that she always seems to have some issue, though they still respect her as an actress.
