

FGP CEO Expresses Grief Over Loss Of Lives, Homes In Floodhit Areas



Islamabad (News Desk) – Muhammad Anwar, CEO of Freedom Gate Prosperity (FGP), expressed deep sorrow over the widespread devastation caused by recent floods across Pakistan, which have claimed over 700 lives and injured nearly 1,000 people. Khyber Pakhtunkhwa was the worstaffected province with 427 deaths, including 228 in Buner District, followed by Punjab (164), Azad Jammu & Kashmir (56), Sindh (29), Balochistan (22), Islamabad (8), and Gilgit-Baltistan (11). More than 209 individuals remain missing, and over 2,400 houses have been damaged or destroyed. Anwar highlighted the role of climate change in these disasters and called for collective action by governments, civil society, and citizens. He urged reduction in plastic use, promotion of public transport, tree plantation, urban greenery, and community preparedness for emergencies. Emphasizing climate-smart lifestyles and policies, he stressed the importance of unity and proactive measures to build resilience against future disasters.

Lahore (News Desk) - Chief Minister Punjab, Maryam Nawaz Sharif, has announced plans to equip the Punjab Police with infrared and ultrasonic technology modeled after the Japanese Police system. The initiative aims to enhance management, accident control, and provide advance weather warnings to the public, with a pilot project set to launch in Lahore. During her visit to Japan, she inspected the National Police Crime Control Agency in Tokyo, learning about its supervisory role over all police departments, emergency management, and policy guidance. Amid Ongoing Israeli Attacks, 'systematic Destruction Of Gaza City Is Already Underway



United Nations (News Desk) - UN human rights officials have warned that Israel's military escalation in Gaza City is causing mass civilian casualties and displacement, with attacks intensifying in the Az Zaytoun neighbourhood. Since August 8, 54 attacks on residential buildings and entire blocks have killed 87 Palestinians, including at least 25 children, while shelters for internally displaced persons have also been targeted, killing at least 14. Hundreds of families have fled, while those trapped face severe shortages of food, water, and medical supplies. The UN Office of the High Commissioner for Human Rights (OHCHR) stated that Israel's reported plan to take full control of Gaza City risks mass killings and infrastructure destruction, constituting grave breaches of the Fourth Geneva Convention. OHCHR urged states to exert maximum pressure on Israel to halt the offensive. Meanwhile, the World Food Programme (WFP) welcomed Japan's \$3.3 million contribution for emergency food and nutrition aid. Limited commercial food truck entries have resumed, but cooking gas shortages and food spoilage risks exacerbate humanitarian conditions. WFP emphasized the urgent need for a ceasefire and sustained aid access to prevent famine in Gaza.

King Of UK Sends Condolence Message To Pakistan Amidst Monsoon Flooding



Islamabad (News Desk) – The King of the United Kingdom expressed his deepest condolences to the people of Pakistan following the devastating monsoon floods and a tragic helicopter crash during rescue operations. In a heartfelt message, he stated that he and his wife were deeply saddened by the loss of lives and widespread destruction, extending sympathy to all those who lost loved ones, homes, and livelihoods.
