Punjab Police, Italian Police Agree to Boost Cooperation Against Terrorism and Organized Crime

Lahore (News Desk) Inspector General of Police (IGP) Punjab Dr. Usman Anwar held a meeting with Major General Luigi Landoli, Head of International Police Cooperation Italy, at the Central Police Office to discuss strengthening cooperation and information sharing in combating terrorism, narcotics, human smuggling, and trafficking. Both sides agreed to enhance mutual benefit through criminal information exchange and bilateral experiences in police and traffic management systems. Senior Punjab Police officers briefed the Italian delegation on modern IT-based applications, policing reforms, Riot Management Police, CTD, Misaq Centers, and other initiatives for public safety and security. Consensus was also reached on officer training programs to benefit from each other's expertise and technologies. Dr. Usman Anwar highlighted the establishment of Virtual Women Police Stations, Virtual Centers for Child Safety, and Tahaffuz Centers for the protection of women, children, transgender persons, and vulnerable groups. Major General Luigi Punjab Police's appreciated innovative measures in public service delivery and its efforts to combat organized crime and terrorism. Later, commemorative shields were exchanged. The Italian delegation Counter-Narcotics included Regional Coordinator Brigadier General Salvatore Colonel Marco Montelino (Special Forces), Colonel Roberto Mattai (Border Police & Immigration), Lieutenant Colonel Roberto Tesorino (International Police Operations), Lieutenant Colonel Constantino Scuderi (Liaison Officer for Pakistan), and Honorary Consul of Italy in Lahore, Fahad Iqbal. From Punjab Police, Additional IG Sultan Ahmed Chaudhary, DIG Riot Management Police, SSP CTD, Operations, AIG Admin, AIG Discipline, and other senior officers also participated.

WASA Ensures Continuous Clean Water Supply to Flood-Affected Areas

Faisalabad (News Desk) The Water and Sanitation Agency (WASA) has ensured an uninterrupted supply of clean drinking water to flood-affected regions, continuing its operations even during public holidays as part of its commitment to public welfare. WASA Managing Director Sohail Qadir Cheema stated that under the directives of Housing Secretary Noorul Amin Mengal, the agency has remained fully mobilized to assist flood-affected communities in Chiniot, Jhang, and Tandlianwala. He explained that three water bowsers are actively distributing clean water across the affected zones, with one water tanker operating from Chiniot Road to Bhowana Road, another covering the Bhowana to Jhang route, and a third serving areas between Chiniot Road and Lahore Road, ensuring displaced families have uninterrupted access to safe drinking water. In addition to tanker supplies, flood victims in Tandlianwala and adjoining riverine areas are being provided with hundreds of 1.5-liter bottled water packs, prepared at WASA's in-house bottling plant. Cheema highlighted that the daily distribution of potable water remains a top priority in all affected regions, and WASA teams are working relentlessly to meet this critical need, with field staff from the Water Directorate deployed alongside the tankers to ensure efficient and effective delivery. He reaffirmed that WASA is utilizing all available resources to maintain this supply at flood relief camps and emphasized that these operations will continue until the full rehabilitation of all affected families is achieved.

ASP Sheherbano Naqvi Becomes First Pakistani Woman Selected for Asia 21 Fellowship

Lahore (News Desk) ASP Sheherbano Naqvi has made history by becoming the first woman police officer in Pakistan to be selected for the prestigious Asia 21 Next Generation Fellowship, Class of 2025, awarded by the Asia Society. She will represent Pakistan among 30 distinguished individuals from 27 countries chosen this year for their outstanding leadership and service. Punjab Minister Zeeshan Rafique Reviews Flood Drainage Operations in Gujrat

Gujrat (News Desk) Punjab Minister for Government Zeeshan Rafique, accompanied by Commissioner Gujranwala Division Naveed Haider Sherazi and Deputy Commissioner Gujrat Noor-ul-Ain Qureshi, visited various parts of Gujrat city to review ongoing drainage and flood management efforts.
