Commonwealth Beach
Handball Championship
Schedule Announced,
Pakistan to Face India on
September 18

Karachi (News Desk) – The draw for the Handball Commonwealth Beach Championship has been announced, with the event scheduled to take place from September 18 to 22 in the Maldives. Pakistan will face India on September 18, followed by matches against Sri Lanka and the Maldives on September 19. On September 20, Pakistan will play against South Africa and then Bangladesh. The semi-finals are set for September 21, with the final on September 22. Pakistan's handball team has already arrived in the Maldives for the championship and played a practice match against the host team on the day following their arrival.

Tensions Evident Between Pakistan and India Players During Asia Cup 2025 Match




Pakistan Captain Salman Ali Agha Boycotts Post-Match Ceremony Over Indian Players' Conduct

Dubai (News Desk) – National T20 team captain Salman Ali Agha boycotted the post-match ceremony due to inappropriate conduct by Indian players. According to sources, Salman Ali Agha refused to participate in the closing ceremony and declined to speak with the Indian presenter. Sources revealed that had there been a Pakistani presenter at the ceremony, the captain would have attended. Pakistan cricket team head coach Mike Hesson confirmed the matter during a press conference, stating that after the match, the Pakistani team intended to shake hands, but regrettably, the Indian team did not come out of their dressing room, prompting Salman Ali Agha to boycott the ceremony. He described the Indian team's behavior as a violation of sportsmanship rules. Notably, at the conclusion of the Pakistan-India match, Indian batters returned to their dressing room without shaking hands with Pakistani players. Despite India's significant defeat, Indian players present in the dressing room did not come onto the ground after the match. 

Dubai (News Desk) — Pakistan team manager Naveed Akram Cheema has formally registered a protest regarding the inappropriate conduct of the Indian team during the Asia Cup, also raising concerns over the match referee's actions. Cheema stated that Indian players' refusal to shake hands violated the spirit of sportsmanship and noted that at the toss, the match referee had requested the captains not to shake hands. Meanwhile, Pakistan captain Salman Ali Agha boycotted the post-match ceremony in protest of the Indian team's behavior. Pakistan team head coach Mike Hesson described the Pakistani response as natural given the unsportsmanlike actions by the Indian team.

Pakistan Head Coach Expresses Disappointment Over

India's Unsportsmanlike Conduct in Asia Cup

Dubai (News Desk) — Pakistan white-ball coach Mike Hesson expressed disappointment over the Indian team's refusal to shake hands with Pakistani players during the Asia Cup match. Speaking at a post-match press conference, Hesson said Pakistan's players were ready to uphold the spirit of the game through the traditional handshake, but their opponents chose not to engage. "Obviously, we were prepared to shake hands at the end of the game, but we were disappointed that the opposition didn't do so. We went forward to greet them, but they were already heading to the dressing room," he added. Hesson described the situation as an unfortunate end to the match, noting that Pakistan's team was satisfied their performance yet faced unsportsmanlike behavior. He also addressed Pakistan captain Salman Ali Agha's absence from the post-match presentation, linking it to the handshake controversy. Traditionally, cricketers shake hands after matches, and captains exchange greetings at the toss; however, India ignored this basic sporting custom. India defeated Pakistan by seven wickets in the match.
