Urdu Writer Hajra Masroor

Karachi (News Desk) – It has been 13 years since the demise of prominent Urdu fiction writer and author Hajra Masroor. Born on January 17, 1930, in Lucknow, India, Hajra Masroor developed a passion for storytelling from an early age and migrated to Pakistan with her family. In Pakistan, she began her journey as a short story writer and fictionist, earning widespread acclaim in literary circles. Hajra Masroor, in collaboration with renowned writer Ahmed Nadeem Qasmi, started the literary journal Naqoosh. She published seven collections of stories and short fiction, including Chand Ke Doosri Taraf, Teesri Manzil, Andhere Ujale, Chori Chhupe, Haye Allah, Charkay, and Woh Log. Besides literature, she also wrote scripts for dramas and several films, earning numerous accolades including the prestigious Nigar Award and, in 1995, the Presidential Award for Pride of Performance in recognition of her contributions to literature. Hajra Masroor passed away on September 15, 2012, in Karachi, leaving behind a legacy that continues to hold a cherished place in literary circles.

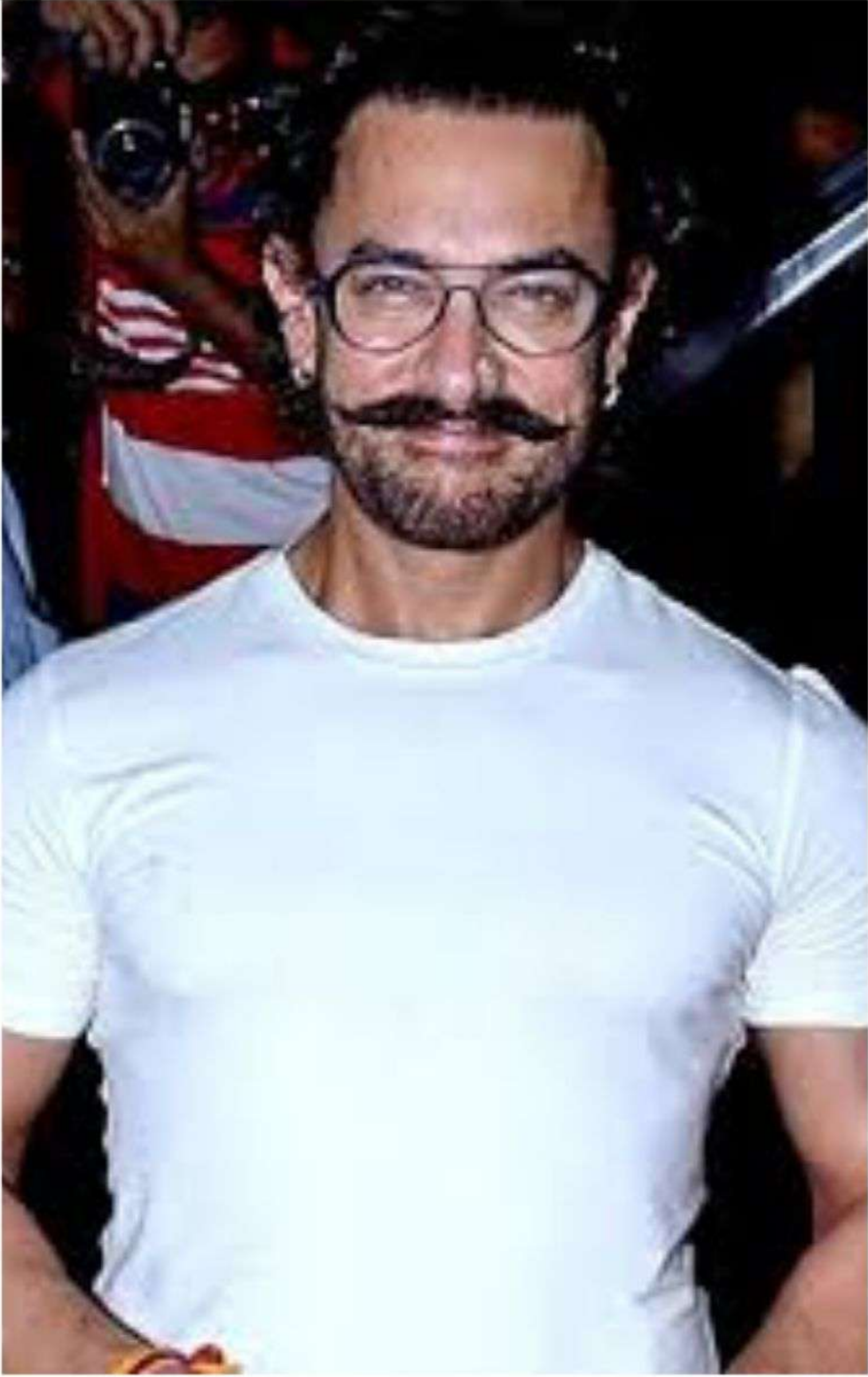
