

## Shilpa Shetty and Raj Kundra Issued Notice in ₹60 Crore Fraud Case



Mumbai (News Desk) – Bollywood actress Shilpa Shetty and her husband Raj Kundra have been issued a lookout notice in a ₹60 crore fraud case after complainant Deepak Kothari alleged that the couple defrauded him, prompting Mumbai Police to take action. The complaint states that the case is linked to the couple’s now-defunct company, Best Deal TV Pvt. Ltd., where they initially sought a loan but later portrayed it as an investment, luring with promises of monthly profits. It is alleged that between 2015 and 2023, over eight years, they took funds under the guise of business capital but instead spent them on personal expenses. Shilpa Shetty reportedly resigned as director of the company in 2016, after which the firm went bankrupt. The Mumbai Police Economic Offences Wing has filed the case, issuing a lookout circular to immigration authorities to prevent the couple from leaving the country during investigation. Meanwhile, the lawyer representing Raj Kundra and Shilpa Shetty has denied the allegations, stating that the matter has no criminal aspect, is an old financial transaction, and is purely a civil issue.

He added that he had seen one of Atiq Odho’s dramas, either Dasht or Nijaat, which highlighted child labor, while from Marina Khan’s dramas, he had only watched Tanhaiyaan and Dhoop Kinare, and not any after that, expressing his wish that one day she would agree to work with him.

## Actress Asma Abbas Opens Up About Her Battle Against Cancer and Health Struggles

Karachi (News Desk) – Renowned Pakistani senior actress Asma Abbas has, for the first time, spoken in detail about her illnesses and her struggle against cancer, revealing in a podcast that her cancer diagnosis was a very difficult time, but with the grace of Allah Almighty and the encouragement of her daughter Zara Noor Abbas, she was able to overcome it. ## Bollywood Actor Ashish Varang Passes Away at 55
