

PITB, ITU Sign Agreement to Digitize Fee Collection with **PayZen**

Lahore (News Desk) Punjab Information Technology Board (PITB) and Information Technology University (ITU) have signed an agreement to digitize the university's fee collection system through PITB's indigenous fintech solution, PayZen. PITB will also train ITU staff and provide continuous technical support. Chairman Faisal Yousaf emphasized that PayZen will deliver user-friendly, transparent, and secure financial processes, benefiting both the university and its students.

Defence Committee Chairman Hails September 6 as Golden Chapter in Pakistan's History



China and Pakistan Launch 2025-2029 Action Plan to Strengthen Strategic Partnership

Beijing (News Desk) China and Pakistan, during Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif's visit to Beijing, released the Action Plan on Building a Closer China-Pakistan Community with a Shared Future in the New Era (2025-2029), marking a new height in their all-weather strategic cooperative partnership and creating unprecedented opportunities for both nations and the wider region. Prof. Cheng Xizhong, Senior Research Fellow at the Charhar Institute, highlighted that the partnership stands as a model in international relations, having grown deeper despite global volatility. He emphasized the Action Plan's extraordinary economic significance, aiming to boost trade, investment, and industrial cooperation under CPEC, enhance infrastructure, energy, and manufacturing sectors, and promote Pakistan's industrial upgrading. Prof. Cheng noted that integrated economic cooperation will strengthen resilience in the global economy, while security cooperation will ensure long-term progress against traditional and non-traditional threats. He further underlined that people-to-people exchanges in education, youth, and culture will inject new vitality into bilateral ties. On the global stage, China and Pakistan will coordinate to amplify the voices of developing countries, uphold fairness, and promote multilateralism, while encouraging regional peace through dialogue. He concluded that the Action Plan provides a grand blueprint for advancing political, economic, security, cultural, and people-to-people relations, contributing significantly to regional and global peace, stability, and prosperity.



Chinese Cauliflower Seeds Boost Yields and Incomes for Pakistani Farmers

Beijing (News Desk) Chinese cauliflower seeds are transforming agriculture in Pakistan by offering higher yields, shorter growth cycles, and affordability compared to Western hybrid varieties. Local farmer Mohammad from Punjab shared that his revenue per season has grown by 50% since adopting Chinese seeds, while agricultural experts confirmed that more than 90% of cauliflower seeds in Pakistan are imported, with China now dominating the market. Scientists from Tianjin Academy of Agricultural Sciences, who completed the world's first cauliflower genome sequencing in 2019, have worked closely with Pakistani technicians to develop stress-resistant varieties suited to South Asia's diverse climates. By mid-2025, Tianjin's seed exports had reached 11 tonnes annually, covering 70% of Pakistan's cauliflower farmland and improving incomes for thousands of farmers. Demonstration bases have been established in over 10 countries, including Pakistan, Vietnam, and France, with more than 800 varieties tested. Experts believe expanding SCO joint research labs could further localize hybrid seed production, reduce costs, and provide even greater benefits to small farmers. Affordable Chinese seeds are not only increasing farmer income but also ensuring that cauliflower remains a staple on Pakistani households' tables.



BISE Rawalpindi Reschedules SSC Second Annual Exams Amid Weather Challenges Rawalpindi (News Desk) The Board of Intermediate and Secondary Education (BISE) Rawalpindi has

rescheduled the SSC second annual examinations, now set to commence on September 29, 2025, due to adverse weather conditions, recent flooding, and continuous rainfall across Punjab that posed difficulties for students and parents. Chairman Muhammad Adnan Khan stated that the three-week delay was introduced to prioritize student convenience and ensure a more conducive environment for exams, while confirming that the new date sheet will be issued soon. He further clarified that the postponement will not affect the results of either the Matric Second Annual or Intermediate Part-II examinations, as the board will continue all processes according to the planned schedule to safeguard students' academic year.
